

## Children Are Forever –

Mrs. Noah and the gang have a passion for teaching Torah. “Mrs. Noah” (Anita Jeré Cannon Dalbey) began this journey to be a scribe YHWH (the LORD God) could use – many years ago. As she felt a need to bring more JOY to the Sabbath and Holy Days, she remembered how the Father gathered His children into Noah’s Ark to protect them. SO, her hope was to help gather His children, again, into the Ark of His protection: HIS WORD.



So, along with writing books and stories, over 6 years ago she began writing a weekly story, following the 1-year Torah reading cycle, as many people do. Several months later, several years ago now, Michael Rood contacted her and asked if she would write stories to go with the 3-year Torah cycle readings – studies for families. Mrs. Noah’s plate got VERY full! We want to support families who are seeking to learn and follow Torah.



Now, we have over 300 stories – with countless lessons – going from B’resheet (Gen) through D’varim (Deut), with Scriptures from the whole Bible scattered throughout. As the stories unfold each week, she counts on The Father to guide her to reach families – of all ages - with a message to help children grasp the MESSAGE – the importance of KNOWING His WORD, and DOING it! WE ARE COMMANDED to teach our children – DILIGENTLY! When we wake up, when we lie down, and when we “walk by the way!” The hope is that this program will bring fun and joy to HIS WORD as it is being taught. Just as the Ark protected Noah and his family from the

destruction brought by the flood (of evil and disobedience) so will knowing and living HIS WORD protect us from the lies and deceptions around us.

Many families around the world are using her family study programs each week – as well as other materials she is developing, including a new weekly curriculum for small congregations and home fellowships. Her “funky” little stories are designed for families who are seeking truth and want to

expand their children's awareness (using their imaginations) of Yah's LIVING WORD and how IT can help change our lives. She often adds crafts, puzzles, quizzes, or a coloring page to the weekly study. All of the Torah (first 5 books of the Bible) have been made into books and hopefully soon put on CDs, and DVDs, that will include music so they can "sing Torah, too." She and her gang feel that children are SO important – they need a lot of interaction in these difficult days.

**Children's Programs:** Mrs. Noah (along with several of her puppets) and a few faithful friends, have worked hard to create exciting memories for the children at various conferences and Holy Day gatherings. The programs often included: music, games, a maze, wilderness survival tips, puppets, obstacle courses, crafts, stories, outside relays and water games, and, when they got tired – late night cartoon Bible movies and healthy snacks.
