Sin – missing the mark – is still something you are learning about. YAH knows that. He gives children time to learn. Just like walking and talking. It takes time."

"But didn't you say we have to pay for sin?" Louise asked. "Is it expensive?"

"Why'd we wanna buy sin?" Cecil asked, as he slipped into the messy kitchen.

"Remember when Max broke the cups? Someone had to pay for them," Mrs. Noah reminded them.

"Did I pay for not telling the truth when I had to sit in time-out?" Hannah asked.

"You wouldn't eat 'em live!" Max snickered.

"Ewehhh!" Hannah groaned.

"Didn't The God give animals to people for food to eat?" Louise asked. [Levit 11:1-12]

"That's correct, Louise," Mrs. Noah commended her, "but not all animals."

"OK. Let's hurry so we can go see Dodi – and see what he can tell us,"

Max said, as he picked up the shop-vac hose and began sucking up

the mess on the floor.



Smells of roasting meat filled the air as Hannah, Max, Cecil, and Louise looked around. There were people everywhere. They were busy caring for animals, cleaning their tents, and preparing food. Children ran from tent to tent playing games and helping with the animals.

"I hope we find Dodi, soon. I want to see a sacrifice," Max told them. "That'll be cool!"

Hannah rolled her eyes. "Boys!"

"I wonder if I should have come along," Louise questioned, as she hid behind Hannah and looked around.

"Cecil. Do you think this is cool?" Louise asked the excited little mouse.

"Well, ta tell joe da truf, I'm gwad I'm a mouse. Dey don't give us as off-rings," he told her.

"Look over there! Isn't that Dodi with that lamb?" Hannah exclaimed.

Dodi saw them and waved. As he came closer, leading the lamb behind him, Max noticed that he looked very sad.

"What's goin' on?" Max asked as he stroked the lamb's face.

"This is the lamb for the offering. We have to sacrifice him," *Dodi's voice quivered as he told Max* – "Today!"

Max saw tears in his eyes. "Will it hurt?"

"No. It is commanded that the animals be cared for and then killed in a special way – so they don't feel any pain." Dodi took a deep breath to help him hold back his tears. "The blood is used to purify the things it is put on. It is used for all of the rituals The Almighty One has commanded."

"Blood? Why blood?" Louise asked.

"Hmmm. Remember, Mrs. Noah told us that sometimes people gave or sacrificed things that were important – even their lives," *Hannah recalled*. "Blood seems to be important for covering up stuff that's not clean."


They all began walking toward the Tabernacle as Max explained, "He must have been angry with Adam

"He threw everything away? Like I do when I draw a picture and don't like it? I start all over with a clean piece of paper," Louise told them.


"Yeah. It was cool. The whole earth was covered by the flood waters. But,


